LOWER RESPONSIBILITY VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

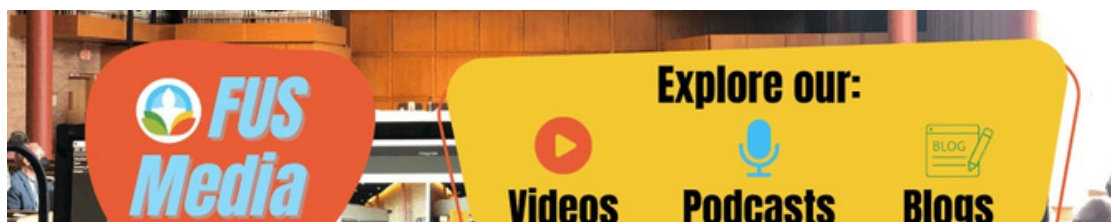
- Child & Family Dinners (3rd Sundays, 4pm-6pm)

 - Looking for a classroom assistant to help with set-up, clean-up, facilitating and encouraging discussion, and assisting youth with projects.

HIGHER RESPONSIBILITY VOLUNTEER ROLES

We can work around your schedule and availability!

- OWL/Our Whole Lives (Sundays, details TBD)
 - We need at least two facilitators to run a 8th/9th OWL course from fall 2026 to spring 2027. *Must have formally undergone OWL facilitator training.*
- Senior High group (dates/times/details TBD)
 - A lead volunteer is required to supervise and facilitate 10th-12th graders in their collaborative planning and execution of Senior High group activities, including utilizing a designated budget.
- Crossing Paths/Neighboring Faiths (Sundays, details TBD)
 - Zola is looking to reinvigorate a comparative religions course for 6th-7th graders! We need a lead volunteer to facilitate a pre-written and adapted curriculum, including walking field trips to local congregations.
